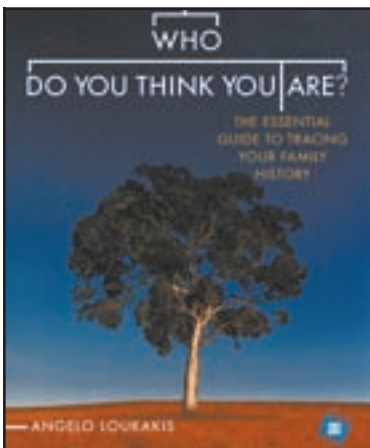
mix of styles that always harks back to the lyric and melody".

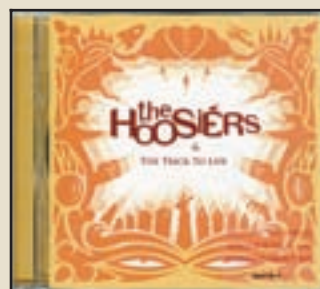
